## Climate Change Adaptation

Develop curricula and implement training on climate change adaptation, climate risk planning and climate-resilient natural resource management for stakeholders

#### Capacity Building Focus

- Training on climate change adaptation and climate-resilient natural resource management for village conservation forum (VCF) members, local level government officers, and national level government officers
- Support Participatory Climate Vulnerability Assessments (PCVA) with communities
- Develop curricula on climate change, REDD+, forest carbon measurement, natural resources management and natural resources co-management for universities

#### Target

50,000 people with improved capacity on climate change adaptation, mitigation and climate-resilient natural resource management

#### Achievements

- 13, 148 VCF members trained on climate change issues
- 1 4 local level government officers trained on a diversity of climate change topics
- 10,000 stakeholders trained on PCVA
- 5 university level curricula developed for 10 national universities and institutes

The capacity building component helps to build the knowledge and capacity of members of community organizations involved in the protection of natural resources, national NGOs and local and national level government officials in three departments: the Forest Department, the Department of Fisheries and the Department of Environment. ## Climate-Resilient Livelihoods

Provide training on financial and entrepreneurial literacy skills and climate-resilient livelihoods activities for resource-poor community members

#### Capacity Building Focus

- Seven-month skill training on Financial and Entrepreneurial Literacy Skills for VCF members
- Skills training on climate-resilient livelihoods options in agriculture (aquaculture, horticulture, livestock, poultry, vermiculture, agronomy) and non-agriculture (weaving, sewing, craft making)
- Training on entry fee revenue sharing collection mechanisms and eco-guide skills
- Gender mainstreaming in natural resource management, climate change adaptation and livelihoods development

#### Achievements

- 58,908 VCF members trained on climate-resilient livelihoods
- 5,664 VCF members trained on financial and entrepreneurial skills
- 14,100 women members trained on climate and NRM management



Develop and implement training on natural resource policies, laws, acts and rules for a diversity of stakeholders

#### Capacity Building Focus

- Orientation on importance and impacts of natural resources policies, laws, acts and rules for Union Parishad and Upazila members and other government officials
- Assess capacity, develop action plans and provide grants and training for co-management organizations (CMO)
- Arrange study tour programs in Bangladesh and overseas

#### Target

550 local government institute members with improved understanding on natural resource laws, acts and climate change issues

#### Achievements

- Training for approximately 60 Union
  Parishad and Upazila members and officers
- More than 100 CMO members participating in cross-site visits within Bangladesh
- 30 government officers with strengthened capacities to implement effective natural resources management gained from study tours to protected areas in Bhutan, Thailand and Australia

# Institutional Financial Management

Develop curricula and arrange training on financial management to build institutional capacity of CMOs

#### Capacity Building Focus

- Training of CMC members on financial management
- Comprehensive institutional management training for qualifying NGOs on USAID procedures
- Entry fee revenue collection and eco-guide development training

#### Achievements

- 500 CMO members trained on grant and financial management
- 6 national NGOs trained on USAID grant management
- 280 CMO members trained on park revenue collection and eco-guide skills
